Steps to Cleaning Mildew

Once you've identified mildew, take the following steps to clean the infected area:

1. Suit Up for Safety

Wear gloves, a mask, and protective eyewear to avoid inhaling or ingesting spores.

2. Ventilate the Area

Open windows or use a fan to keep the area well-ventilated and prevent mildew from spreading.

3. Select a Cleaning Product

Options include:

- Detergent and water
- Disinfectant
- Store-bought mildew cleaner
- Hydrogen peroxide (Pro Tip)

4. Scrub Thoroughly

Use a soft brush or cloth to apply the cleaner and scrub away any visible residues.

5. Rinse and Dry

Rinse the cleaned area with water and ensure it's completely dry. Dryness is the most effective deterrent to mildew.

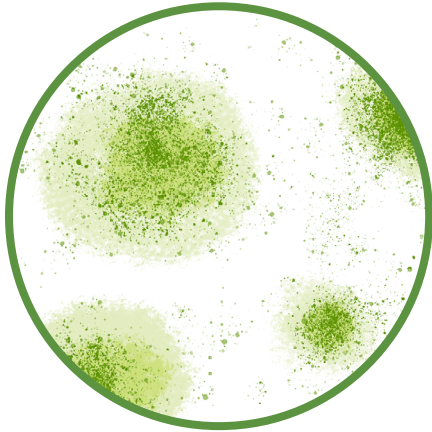
While mildew might seem like a mild-mannered enemy, underestimating it can lead to bigger or more persistent cases.

Steps to Cleaning Mold

If you or a professional has identified mold in your house, follow these guidelines for cleaning and removing it.



1. Safety First

Wear gloves, an N95 mask (or better), and protective eyewear to safeguard your health.

2. Assess the Situation

For extensive mold (over 10 square feet) or mold caused by sewage or contaminated water, contact professional mold remediation services.

3. Use Ventilation

Open windows or use an exhaust fan to keep air moving. Contain the area using plastic sheets to prevent spreading spores. Use disposable cleaning materials and discard them immediately after use.

4. Choose Your Cleaning Solution

- For nonporous surfaces: Water and detergent mixture.
- For porous surfaces: Professional judgment is critical.

5. Start Scrubbing

Use a stiff brush to apply the cleaning solution. Be thorough but gentle to avoid dispersing spores or damaging surfaces.

6. Rinse, Dry, and Evaluate

Rinse the area well and dry it completely. If mold growth persists, contact professionals.
